Adopting St Albans Abbey Station

Do you use the Abbey Flyer on a regular basis? Are you willing to keep an eye on it and report any problems once a week or so? We are looking to find a few people who could be part of a team monitoring the condition of the Abbey station. The Abbey Community Rail Partnership wants the local community to "adopt" all the stations along this route as part of a programme of turning round unstaffed and uncared stations in order to bring them into the heart of the community. This in turn encourages better use of public transport. Most of the stops have already been adopted but no group has come forward to adopt the Abbey station until now. The Sopwell Residents Association has agreed to help out. There are two types of station adoption: the first is for station monitors to act as the "eyes and ears" and regularly report problems to the train operating company; and the second is to undertake a variety of activities which would improve the look of the station e.g. provision of garden plants and bulbs etc. At present we are just looking to be station monitors and if this proves successful we will look into greater involvement. The role is not at all onerous and should not take more than a few minutes.

So if you are a regular Flyer commuter and want to help or if you want more information please contact us and we can coordinate a team of helpers. We will also raise this at the AGM in May.

New 10 to 3 Club for older people in Sopwell

Age Concern Hertfordshire and Age Concern St Albans are working in partnership to deliver a new service to older people in Sopwell. A 10 - 3 club is held at Betty Entwhistle House, Holyrood Crescent. Volunteering with Hertfordshire Constabulary

Do you want to learn more about policing in Hertfordshire or have a passion for helping out in your local community? If so, why not join the growing team of dedicated Police Community Volunteers. We have volunteering opportunities across the county which will enable you to get involved in projects and help make the county a safer place. More than 65 people in Hertfordshire have already signed up to the scheme. If you have just a few hours to spare each week or month, there are opportunities available in your local Station. Chief Constable Frank Whiteley said: "Volunteers are an important part of the extended police family and are making a huge contribution to the services we offer the community. Volunteering is a great opportunity to become more involved with policing in your community, put your skills to good use or even learn new ones. Your time will be spent assisting teams of highly dedicated officers and staff with community-related tasks and you can fit volunteering around the hours that suit you."

Volunteers are not a replacement for police officers and staff but help the Constabulary provide an enhanced service to the community. Some of the tasks available are: administrative, organising Community meetings, telephone enquiries, internet/intranet research, updating internal/external records, leaflet production/or distribution and newsletter collation.

As well as the opportunity to give something back to the community, volunteering:

looks great on your CV; gives you the chance to brush up on your interpersonal skills and allows you to gain confidence in a professional environment; is a chance to work with a team of dedicated people; and is a chance to find out more about your local police force.

150th anniversary of Abbey Flyer

The year 2008 marks the 150th year of the St Albans to Watford Branch Line. Now known as the Abbey Line or the Abbey Flyer, it is well-used and well-loved by many local residents in Sopwell. ABFLY (the Rail User Group) and the Abbey Line Community Rail Partnership are planning some celebrations this year to commemorate this historic occasion. At the time of going to press, not all details have been finalised but we can share the following information.

We are currently planning to have festivities on Bank Holiday Monday 5th May, 2008, the actual anniversary of the opening of the Abbey Line. We plan to hold an exhibition at the St Stephen's Parish Centre and a fun fair in Bricket Wood to commemorate Henry Gray's original fun fair established in 1889. A miniature railway has been secured. There will also be a set of commemorative postcards and tickets available to those who come to the exhibition. We aim to run a special train on the Abbey Line that day. There are a few other activities being planned at St Albans and at Watford, these details will be announced at a later date.

In the run up to the official day, we are planning to hold a Victorian Music Hall about the Abbey Line on Saturday 26th of April at 3 pm at the Abbey Theatre. There are also tentative plans to sell a commemorative ale to celebrate the 150th birthday of the Abbey Line in early April. There may be some local lectures in April and possibly a guided walk along paths near the line in the summer. St Albans Toy Library is back!

St Albans Toy Library is now up and running once again at St Julian's Church Hall, Abbots Avenue West (off Cottonmill Lane). Catering for children from birth to eight, the library has a wide selection of toys to lend, including outdoor and special needs toys. Special rates apply for childminders and those in receipt of benefits. The library provides a great place for local parents and carers to meet and enjoy a free cup of tea or coffee while children play and enjoy craft activities. Annual membership is $\pounds 4$ and toys can be borrowed for 1 to 2 weeks from between 25p to $\pounds 1$. Open every Tuesday during term time, from 10am to 12 noon.

Annual litter pick

Every year the SRA takes part in the St Albans Litter Pick week and over the past five years we have collected loads of rubbish which has been dropped by anti-social litter louts. Litter picking in Sopwell this year will be on 5th and 6th April. On Saturday 5th April, we are meeting outside Mandeville school between 2-4pm and on Sunday 6th April we will do our usual litter pick at Sopwell Priory. We plan to meet by the benches opposite the ruins at 2pm. Please come and join us on either date to help us in our quest to make Sopwell a cleaner place to live. All equipment will be provided. 

Planting trees

The SRA is committed to improving the environment around Sopwell and we are working with the Council to plant more trees in the streets. Pavements and potholes

Some of the roads and pavements in Sopwell are in a sorry state. The problem is that unless someone complains about them, nothing is done by the Highways department as they are not inspected regularly for faults. Residents of Tavistock Avenue recently sent in a petition complaining about the state of the pavements and Herts Highways agree that there are faults to be remedied.
